FROM THE EDITOR

A lot of good stuff has been happening with the Ripcord Association. It has been quite busy around here.

Author Chris Brady, whose father was in A/2-506, is writing a new book telling the story of Firebase Ripcord and the battles around the firebase. Chris has interviewed about 100 Ripcord veterans so far and is looking to interview many more. Get in touch with me at frank@ripcordassociation.com to schedule an interview by e-mail, phone or in person. Time is running out. I plan on another interview session here at my home in Mount Laurel, NJ in July or August.

The Ripcord Association is in the process of incorporating. Since 1985, starting with 12 members, we have just been a group of Ripcord veterans having get-togethers. We now have 527 Ripcord veterans and 110 Associate members and due to financial and legal matters, we must incorporate.

I am working on a more accurate list of those who were killed in The Battle of Firebase Ripcord. It is very time consuming and very controversial. I have gathered the names of every casualty in I Corps from March 12 thru July 23rd 1970, looking up each individual name and unit they were in. I am removing those not associated with the 101st and those not involved directly with Ripcord. I am also removing a lot of casualties that were in Operation Texas Star but not in Ripcord. (Ripcord was part of Operation Texas Star).

The documentary *The Ghosts of Ripcord* is still being worked with professional finishing touches. We are trying to get a figure on the cost to complete it and will keep you updated.

Unfortunately, as much as I tried to communicate with the producers of the movie (not the documentary) *The Battle of Ripcord*, it was to no avail! Many of our Ripcord members did not trust the production company to make this movie happen, but I kept trying. Seems they were right about this producer and his company. His movie about Ripcord will not be a reality, only a wishful dream.

Walter Reed Army Hospital

For the April to December 2013 deployment of the 506th Regiment/4th BCT to Afghanistan, our 506th Association has provided support to our wounded troopers and their families at Walter Reed Army Hospital, assisting during their often lengthy recoveries. We visit them on a weekly basis.

This visitation program ministers often to unrecognized needs of both the wounded trooper and their family. When we walk into to the soldier's room for the first visit, we meet their mothers and fathers, their wives and children, aunts and uncles, younger and older brothers and sisters, and other family friends. Their needs during this difficult time of recovery are sometimes similar, but can vary greatly. By assessing the needs of each trooper and their family, we can provide the right level of assistance during our weekly visitation. Once they become out-patients, we sponsor community activities, such as spring and summer BBQs for the soldiers and their families, along with other opportunities for the soldiers and their families to leave the hospital grounds to attend concerts, sporting and other social events.

We provide each wounded soldier with a Currahee gift set which includes a Currahee flag, a Currahee baseball hat, a Currahee challenge coin, Currahee gym bag, and small Currahee regimental pins for their family members. We additional provide financial assistance for the unexpected needs of the family, such as travel costs, child support and other related expenses while the family is at Walter Reed hospital. We have often assisted the soldiers in resolving problems that cause negative concerns and worries that work against the positive attitudes necessary for a good recovery from severe wounds. Lifting such burdens from wounded soldiers allowed them to fully apply their thoughts and energies to their recoveries.

We will continue to provide support to our wounded troopers and their families until the last one leaves Walter Reed hospital.

Katherine and I had a great time at Fort Campbell! Thank you to Frank Marshall and Jim Campbell for nominating me for my Distinguished Member of the Regiment Award. I was humbled that the guys I led in Vietnam nominated me and that they attended the ceremony.

The fun started at Harper House. We had great reconnecting conversations at this event.

The next day we met in the lobby of our hotel. Frank Marshall showed up looking great in a suit, a cashmere overcoat and a hat. Tiny Aanonsen said, "Look, they sent us a limo driver!" I think that was one of the funniest comments we heard.

We were assigned a young 2LT as our guide for the ceremony. He was 24, a year older than I was in Vietnam. He looked so young. I said to him, "Katherine is going to ask you, why aren't you in school?" He had read the Ripcord book.

Moving and touching does not nearly describe the ceremony honoring the soldiers killed in the last deployment. I welled up several times, especially when I saw a toddler in his mother's arms touching the name of his father who was killed.

Jim Campbell took us to the 1LT Kalsu Replacement Center where my photo's of Ripcord are on display. They are remodeling the center and I have sent them fresh copies. Jim told the tale of calling the athletic department at Oklahoma for a number "77" jersey. He was turned down flat. "We don't give jerseys to just anybody." What?? He knew that the quarterback from the undefeated Oklahoma team of the 50's was in his office building. He went down and spoke to the guy and, by the time he got back to his office, the athletic

director was on the phone saying, "Where do you want it sent!" Jim is a guy who gets things done.

On Thursday, we attended a dinner of the C Co guys who came along after us. There was a moving reading of the names of the soldiers killed in Vietnam, followed by a bell ring for each of them. Afterward we went to the American Legion Post. This is where the young 'uns were present and were "adopted" as Big Brothers by the Vietnam veterans. Bob Leibecke has declared this his "sacred mission." This is where Glynn Hale, Charlie Lieb, Jim Campbell, Ken Pitetti and I received our framed guidons. They give it to the officers and platoon sergeants who attend for the first time as a tribute to those who brought them back alive.

They had a raffle and Katherine said these guys should have their own game show. Lots of laughs. One of the young 'uns picked a T-shirt from the raffle and said, "A small will work for me." Steve Bago shouted, "Condom that is."

On Friday we attended the Currahee Rendezvous Ball in Nashville. We thought we might be put in the back at the old folks table and, instead, we were seated with the C Co. CO, XO, 1st SGT and Platoon SGT and their wives at a table in front. We had terrific conversations with them and found them very respectful and in awe of what the Vietnam veterans went through. The XO had read the Ripcord book, too. One guy specifically mentioned their night vision gear and how they can see everything that moves. I always say that is the one thing they have that I would have given anything to have in our day.

In addition to my DMOR certificate, I was given two coins, a framed C Co guidon, a C Co hat, two Currahee ball glasses, and a black spade from the centerpiece at the ball presented to me by the CO. I have had great difficulty putting the "coul'da, should'a" behind me for my actions in Vietnam. I have this stuff on the mantle and I am letting it in and putting it in the past.

I was in a Vet Center rap group in '81 and felt

hopeless about my future. One of the guys declared that he was never going to smile again as a tribute to his dead buddies. In that moment I realized that I was going to live the life I would have wished for my dead comrades - full of love, friends, happiness, prosperity. I declared myself a "Living Memorial" and am working every day to be that.

We learned when we were working professionally in the veterans community in the early '80's, that being together with people who shared your experience is healthy. We also proved that, when you take something on together, it is an even more powerful experience. I suspect that Kathy and Lee Widjeskog, Frank Marshall, Fred Spaulding, Red and Bob Judd, Anthony Critchlow, Bob Leibecke, Mary and George Murphy and Bob Seitz and others in the Ripcord community doing things in their local area are getting tons of satisfaction from taking on a purpose that is larger than themselves.

I am working on a project to network support for the West Michigan Veterans Assistance Program (WMVAP), an all volunteer non-profit consisting of veterans, spouses and friends. They are dedicated to assisting homeless and about to be homeless vets and families in our region. They fill in the gaps in available services. There are about 200 homeless vets in Grand Rapids MI alone and many more spread throughout the six county region that WMVAP serves. Estimates range up to thirty percent of homeless nation wide are vets. One in five are women veterans. Many of them are alcoholics/mentally ill and a great many are just down on their luck. Twenty-two vets are committing suicide daily! WMVAP is dragging wounded from the battlefield of hunger and homelessness.

Now that we are retired, this is our mission. We would like to see reports in the Ripcord newsletter from other vets and families who are taking on projects that make a difference for veterans and families in their communities. We can share ideas, commitment and cheerleading!
