Subject: Airplanes

After every flight, all pilots complete a "gripe" sheet which is meant to list problems encountered with the aircraft during the flight. The mechanics use this checklist to make repairs and/or corrections. The actual form is a piece of paper that the pilot completes, and submits to the mechanics for action.

S: Engine found on right wing, after brief search.

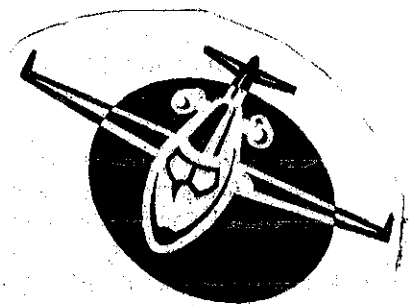
P: Aircraft handles funny.

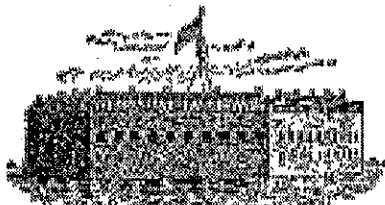
