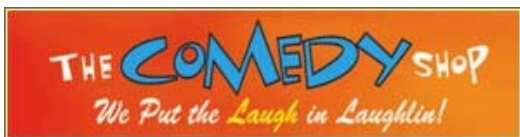
## Leroy's Sports Book Beach Club Bingo

## John Sherba, Recon, E 2/506

This year, "Doc Speed" former medic for Bravo Team of Recon, will turn 60 on July 23rd. He and the other (five to eight) men that made up a team of Recon spent days and weeks in the jungles and hills outside the Ashau Valley in 1969 and 1970 searching for North Vietnamese Army Regulars while trying to avoid detection and contact. They did this leading up to Ripcord and after Ripcord.

John was born and raised in Cape May County New Jersey. After graduating from high school he got a job working for a mason. Soon the inevitable happened and he received his draft notice. It was early summer 1968. On the advice of his father he decided to ignore it knowing that it would take them a while to seek him out. By the end of summer he found himself in Basic Training at Fort Dix. Here he built a severe dislike for KP (probably due to some left over feelings from working one summer in an Italian restaurant).

As he finished up training the Army "volunteered" John for medic schooling at Fort Sam Houston. Once the training was done one of his buddies talked him into going airborne so off they went to Fort Benning. His buddy dropped out but John got his wings and then an assignment with the 82nd Airborne at Fort Bragg with the 3/508 Infantry. While assigned there he parachuted into the Canal Zone for three weeks of Jungle training and also dropped onto Puerto Rico for even more training. Again he found too much of his time being assigned to KP. Wanting to avoid this duty at all costs, he volunteered for Vietnam.

Sherba arrived in Vietnam in November 1969, got assigned to the 101st and the 158th Aviation for medics

and once more was pulling KP. Having had enough of this "—" he volunteered for Recon. His first team was Alpha.

On one of his first missions in the field the boys got into a little altercation with some guys from North Vietnam. Sherba killed both of the NVA very quickly while some of the other guys were still getting their guns up. From that event, he got the name "Doc Speed" as a play on words, because as we remember from anti-drug posters of the day "Speed Kills". It was evident to the members of Alpha that Doc Sherba "kills".

After a series of bad adventures in the field, most of the Alpha team re-upped to get out of the field. Doc Speed was transferred to Bravo team where he worked with John Mihalka and others who have become life long friends.

By 10 July, Sherba was given a "rear" job working the aid station on Fire Support Base Ripcord. He was there for the evacuation and was soon once again going in the field with recon till he left country in October.

John flew into Washington, checked out of the Army and four days after he left Vietnam; he was home in Cape May County pushing concrete for the mason as if he had never left. In 1976 he married his wife Debbie and together they have had three daughters and one son. John started his own business as a mason and retired a few years

ago as his knees and some ailments from Vietnam have worn him down. He still hunts birds and an occasional deer and all year long you can find him near a fishing pole by a lake or on the bay or ocean. In spite of all he has been through and seen he is usually in good spirits whenever you see him.
