The 2025 Reunion will be at The Ellie Beach Resort located at the south end of Myrtle Beach. It is just three miles (10 minutes) from the Myrtle Beach Airport. The Hotel is also located two miles from the Market Common Shopping and Restaurant District, formally the old Air Force Base.

Murrells Inlet, known as "Seafood Capital of South Carolina" offers from fine-dining restaurants with white tablecloths to burger joints where you can discard peanut shells on the floor. Murrells Inlet also has a wonderful selection of restaurants for any taste. Of course, the area is famous for fresh seafood that is caught daily, including crabs, oysters, clams, and seasonal fish. Enjoy all of your favorite seafood dishes, as well as any other type of cuisine in Murrells Inlet. They are located 10 miles from hotel.

Room rate this year is \$110. The resort fee is \$15. (\$110 + \$15 * 12% tax + \$1 destination fee = \$141 total per night. The hotel reservation link is on the registration form page 5 and on our website. *Ripcordassociation.com*

Also, the Association is providing donuts and pastries for the mornings of Monday-Tuesday-Wednesday in the Hospitality room. The hotel will provide plenty of coffee between hours of 7am until 10am.

SPICE UP YOUR CUISINE

CAMP EVANS - After an infantryman has been in the field for a long period of time, the limited selection of C-rations meals ceases to be tasty.

Rations designed for long range patrols add a little variety to his meal, but during a year spent in the field, that makes a steady diet of only 18 different meals.

So after a short time in the field, many soldiers become culinary experts. Instead of the basic meals that are offered, an ingenious infantryman can come up with a unique meal.

"Currahees" of Co. B, 1st Bn. (Airmobile) 506th Inf. have become Master Chefs in their own right. The resupply personnel in the rear also help them by sending out accessories, such as Worcestershire sauce, onions, ketchup, and other ingredients to help boost a meals flavor.

So, with spices in hand, the Screaming Eagles are ready to prepare their meals.


Cheese is used to flavor anything from ham and turkey to chili and spaghetti. It is also used to spread over beef with spice sauce on a cracker to make pizza.

Also, the "Currahees" mix a chili long range patrol ration with a can of spaghetti, with the result being quite a tasty dish.

Beef slices with potatoes, beef with spiced sauce, beans and meatballs, and beans and franks are commonly combined with beef, hash, beef with rice, or beef stew, with flavorful results.

"With a little bit of imagination, you can eat like a king," stated Sergeant Adolph Heinz, Blackburn, Mo. "There isn't any reason to eat plain meals, if you use your head, even little things add variety. I even put hot sauce in my peanut butter, that gives it kind of a tangy taste."

SPORADIC MONSOON RAINS by BILL HEATH A 2/506th INF

Many of my Ripcord brothers came in country in late 1969 and many more arrived in mid 1970. If you arrived, like I did in October 1969, you were treated to extreme rain. Now I came from Riverside, California and the rainfall for October had been a total of ONE inch, and the entire of 1969 was 10.5 inches.

The Army announced that the record rainfall was restricting allied operations in the canopy jungle. No BS there trooper. They said the minimum monthly rain record was 8.9 inches. The maximum monthly rain record was 27.2 inches. SO, what did this actual October 1969 rainfall total...an incredible 62.47 inches. It continued. The 24-hour maximum rainfall record was broken with 17.21 inches recorded in one 24-hour period. The old record was 11.1 inches.
