The 2025 Reunion will be at The Ellie Beach Resort located at the south end of Myrtle Beach. It is just three miles (10 minutes) from the Myrtle Beach Airport. The Hotel is also located two miles from the Market Common Shopping and Restaurant District, formally the old Air Force Base.

Murrells Inlet, known as "Seafood Capital of South Carolina" offers from fine-dining restaurants with white tablecloths to burger joints where you can discard peanut shells on the floor. Murrells Inlet also has a wonderful selection of restaurants for any taste. Of course, the area is famous for fresh seafood that is caught daily, including crabs, oysters, clams, and seasonal fish. Enjoy all of your favorite seafood dishes, as well as any other type of cuisine in Murrells Inlet. They are located 10 miles from hotel.

The Reunion in Myrtle Beach is just two months away. The cutoff date for hotel reservations at the negotiated Ripcord



FIRST REUNION **10 OCTOBER 1986**

Our 2026 reunion next year will be 40th Anniversary since the official beginning of the Ripcord Association Reunions. Fellow Ripcord veterans had been trying to find one another for a few years in the mid 80's, but that was a very challenging time. No computers, trying to remember facts about where people lived 15 years before, then calling the 411 operator for assistance. Me saying: "Do you have a number for a Billy Helvey in Texas?" She says: "What city?" I responded with: "I don't know, how about Dallas and Fort Worth?" In a firm voice she answers; "Only one city at a time please." "Okay, Dallas." I say in a hopeful voice. Then she gives me 15 possible phone numbers. My finger goes into the hole on the rotary dial and the calls begin. One city, no luck. Two cities, same result. This is how our small group began to form.

Talking to Chip Collins (the man who really started getting us together and was elected the first President), was also talking with John Mihalko (the first elected Secretary/Treasurer), plus Frank Marshall and Chuck Hawkins about a possible get together. John lived in Whippany, N.J. and was a member of their VFW Post 5351. This Post was selected for the reunion and our Whippany Support Team would help in organizing and operations of the facility. Team Post members: Don Davidson, Bruce Oliver, Bill Gross, Bud Fitzsimmons and Pat Kruger. Ladies Auxiliary of Post 5351: Mary Gross, Bud's daughter Ann Marie, plus many other ladies and gentlemen representing veterans groups participated.
